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Message from the President



The year 2023 was unquestionably marked by the war in Gaza and the increase in conflicts worldwide, particularly in Ukraine, leading to devastating consequences for affected populations, international trade and migratory flows. Raw resources were impacted, starting with energy. Development budgets were redirected towards defence. Global governance faltered, often paralyzing international institutions.

At European level, 2023 saw the gradual erosion of fundamental rights and the rule of law, affecting member state security. Traditionally a leader in terms of democracy, Europe faced extremism, electoral interference, fake news and media weakening, disrupting its position.

Our small country, Switzerland, was not immune to international and regional tensions either. These tensions have attacked our neutrality, a principle



considered fundamental to our foreign policy. Is it possible for our country not to be drawn into foreign conflicts? Some believe so, but this has progressively put us at odds with our political and economic partners, as well as with the populations affected, thus shaking our principles of living together.

In view of these three dimensions, the **Caux** Foundation's mission of reconciling differences is more necessary than ever. In 2023, it has equipped itself with the resources and strategies to accomplish this mission with realism and humility. It welcomed the Initiatives of Change network in large numbers during the Caux Forum. It anchored its activities firmly in International Geneva by revitalizing its representative office there. It forged new partnerships. It brought the Caux Palace to life.

With the arrival of our Executive Director, Ignacio **Packer**, in May 2023, we have turned the page on the COVID years and opted for an agile structure in tune with the times. We are acutely aware of the limitations of our business, which will never solve mass conflicts. Our approach to personal change will always involve the individual, and our fondest hope is that every person we meet will become an ambassador for change. This is no easy task, but it's the only one that lasts.

Message from the Executive Director

Joining **Caux Initiatives of Change** in May 2023, during a period of managerial transition, was no simple task. It required a thorough immersion in the organization's values, mission and relationships, with one of my main priorities being to address cultural challenges and improve staff morale.

My onboarding was extensive and involved 150 interviews in 90 days—half within the IofC network and the other half externally. These discussions provided invaluable insights and assessed how my vision resonated with others.

Achievements and strategic goals

The first Caux Forum in July 2023 since COVID-19 was a major challenge for our new team. However, through great collaboration with lofC International, we successfully navigated it. This experience underscored what we can achieve through trust and a shared vision.

Another key achievement for 2023 has been establishing pace and direction for a highperforming team built on trust. We have flattened the organizational structure, allowing for greater responsibility and better information flow.

Two key engagement strategies were set in motion in 2023: one within Switzerland and another on the global level, through our increasingly recognized role in International Geneva. These engagement strategies are designed to enhance our impact and align closely with our mission.

Building a better future for us all


Reflecting on the past year, I am proud to be part of




Through our **'Hospitality for** Change' concept, primarily at our centre for dialogue, the Caux Palace and Villa Maria, we organize, coordinate and host international



Its formal membership is made up of 36 national bodies and programmes. Each member operates autonomously on projects addressing specific local needs. Informal teams and initiatives exist in other countries. Initiatives of Change International has ECOSOC accreditation and is an INGO member of the Council of Europe.

Friends of Caux, a Swiss association, works actively with **Caux Initiatives of Change**. It connects people living across Switzerland who are interested in implementing projects that further the aims of Initiatives of Change and increase the visibility of the Caux Forum. In 2023 Friends of Caux members were actively involved in welcoming participants and volunteering at the Caux Forum. Drawing on lofC programmes, they also organized a Creators of Peace Circle, and met twice in Caux for the General Assembly and for a Friends of Caux weekend. Members of the group came together in Bern for regular 'Welle 7' meetings for collective reflection on a chosen theme and to offer mutual support.

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Global Engagement in International Geneva

Caux Initiatives of Change has long been engaged in International Geneva, fostering essential partnerships to pursue innovative and sustainable solutions to global challenges. Our convening role provides a platform for international actors in International Geneva to exchange, collaborate and leverage mutual expertise. Our engagement has been facilitated in part by lofC International's ECOSOC accreditation and INGO membership of the Council of Europe.

Our contributions to the work of the United Nations from 2021 to 2024 reflect our commitment to promoting values of peace, justice, reconciliation and sustainable development on both local and global levels. By actively participating in UN sessions, conferences and consultations, lofC helps to shape international policies and agendas, advocating for ethical and sustainable solutions to global problems. Key engagements include the Global Refugee Forum, the United Nations Climate Change Conference and IOM Dialogues

on Migration, where our input has contributed to reinforcing UN-led processes. Additionally, Caux Initiatives of Change empowers young leaders through youth-led projects and programmes, ensuring their meaningful inclusion in global governance processes and decision-making.

The Caux Palace serves as a catalyst for innovation and transformation, hosting neutral and discreet dialogues and mediations for UN agencies and other international actors. This reinforces International Geneva's position as a hub for trustbuilding and collaborative solutions.

Central to our strategy is enhancing the collective influence of civil society to emphasize the critical role of inner development in achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). lofC aims to make International Geneva a major centre for the Inner Development Goals, which are essential for realizing the SDGs.

2023, A Year of Growth, Collaboration, and Trust


2023 was a dynamic and fruitful period for our hospitality service, as international organizations resumed meetings, conferences and events after the pandemic. This resurgence meant that NGOs were looking for safe spaces for their gatherings, which we could provide.

New teams came on board during the year who improved and standardized our operational model, ensuring client satisfaction and the smooth running of events. We adopted new ways of working and new hospitality management software to enhance efficiency and precision, and took a forward-looking approach to marketing and promotion.

We strengthened our collaboration with leading Swiss academic organizations who held meetings at Caux as part of major scientific congresses. Close teamwork with SHMS, the hospitality school which shares our building, proved fruitful for both parties.

During 2022 the Villa Maria provided accommodation for Ukrainian families. This year we returned the building to use as a venue, having upgraded the facilities, including installing a new, fully equipped kitchen. We were able to offer customers personalized experiences, innovative catering and diverse cultural activities integrated with lofC's principles and building on over 75 years of experience in group hospitality.

As well as the Caux Forum, 2023 saw an expansion of cultural and artistic events, aligning with our commitment to diversity and creative expression. Events in collaboration with local foundations strengthened our relationships with the community, highlighting our commitment to openness and inclusion.



Celebrating the 30th anniversary of the Étoile filante Foundation with Initiatives of Change was an experience of pure magic. They pushed back the walls and met every challenge. Families were able to share moments of quality, cocooning and leisure. Stakeholders on the social, family and entertainment level were able to create synergies to the delight of children and adults alike. Caux Forum 2023



The Caux Forum, held annually at the Caux Palace, is Caux Initiatives of Change's flagship event. Featuring conferences, training sessions, and dialogues, its mission is to inspire, equip, and foster connections among individuals, groups and organizations, empowering them to contribute to a more just, peaceful and sustainable world.

This year, the Caux Foundation and Initiatives of Change International co-organized the Caux Forum, marking the first full-scale in-person event since the Covid-19 pandemic. The Foundation managed the Opening Ceremony and hospitality, welcoming over 550 participants from 72 countries over two weeks, fostering cross-cultural and crosssector connections.

The 2023 forum featured dialogues and workshops on two key themes: Healing the Wounds of the Past and Trust and Integrity in Democracy. Expert speakers shared their insights, providing a rich foundation for dialogue and inspiration.

In 2024, Caux Initiatives of Change, in collaboration with lofC International, will organize the Caux Forum with three key conferences:

- The Caux Inner Development Goals Forum, in partnership with the Inner Development Goals Foundation
- The Caux Democracy Forum

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



Opening Ceremony: Strengthening Democracy—the Journey from Trauma to Trust 18 July, 2023

This year's opening ceremony at the Caux Palace, organized by Caux Initiatives of Change, attracted over 400 in-person participants and 200 livestream viewers. Gerald Pillay, President of lofC International, and Jacqueline Coté, President of Caux Initiatives of Change, delivered welcome addresses, followed by Rea Gehring from the Swiss Department of Foreign Affairs (FDFA).

The keynote address was given by Elena Zhemkova, Co-founder of Memorial and Nobel Peace Prize laureate, who emphasized honesty as a tool for healing historical wounds and advocated for reclaiming truth and upholding the principle of non-violence. Ignacio Packer moderated a panel discussion with Zhemkova, Mô Bleeker, former Special Envoy for Peace and Prevention of Atrocities for the Swiss FDFA, and Corinne Momal-Vanian. Executive Director of the Kofi Annan Foundation.

Healing the Wounds of the Past 17 – 22 July



After decades in which conflict has gradually reduced around the world, the tide has turned. Conflict is increasing. This forum, with **over 300 participants**, focused on a fundamental cause of this trend: the broken relationships caused by unhealed wounds of the past. The theme of healing created a platform for participants to develop heightened skills in dialogue facilitation, conflict transformation, trauma awareness and storysharing.

Programmes and Initiatives from the lofC Network during the Caux Forum 2023



Trustbuilding Program



The lofC International award-winning programme addresses community polarization and promotes lasting peace by reconciling conflicts and building trust at the grassroots level. Over four days, team members from trustbuilding proarammes in nine countries came together to learn and develop their trustbuilding skills.



Caux Scholars Program



With participants from 15 countries, the 2023 Caux Scholars Program showcased diversity and international collaboration. Over 21 days, Dr David Anderson Hooker guided the Scholars through global dynamics, exploring narratives, identity, power, history, culture and leadership.



Caux Round Table for Moral Capitalism



Drawing from diverse backgrounds, participants focused on governance and leadership principles for a new global ethic, emphasizing urgency in engaging leaders from business, government, and civil society to restore trust in institutions.





Initiatives for Land, Lives and Peace (ILLP) bridges international organizations and local communities, fostering positive change for people, places and the planet. The Academy united climate scientists and others to address barriers to cooperation, emphasizing the importance of trust, good governance and empowerment in achieving sustainable development.

Inner Development Goals (IDG) Workshops at the Caux Palace

On 13 September 2023, in partnership with the **IDG Lemanic Hub, Caux Initiatives of Change** delivered four parallel Inner Development Goal workshops to 60 participants from International Geneva and other like-minded organizations and institutions. Our guests received an introduction to the IDG Framework, especially crucial for leaders who address the SDGs but fundamentally for all of us! Thank you for the safe and beautiful space to delve deeper into the topics of change. I believe more synergies and active cooperation can/ should arise in this domain. It becomes increasingly clear that both internal and external alignments are essential factors in catalyzing a collective effort aimed at purposefully driving positive change in the world. With hope and enthusiasm for the possibilities that lie ahead, I look forward to reconnecting and acting alongside.

Geneva Peace Week

As part of the 2023 Geneva Peace Week, Caux Initiatives of Change partnered with **Principles for Peace, CHS Alliance, Creative Leadership** and the **IDG Lemanic Hub** to host a workshop titled **'Increase Our Collective Abilities to Face Complex Challenges— promoting peace and inclusive societies.'** In an interactive Sprint Lab format, 45 participants explored methods for collective solutions, offering immediate answers and discussing next steps. An online session two weeks later finalized the process, emphasizing the importance of both 'what' and 'how' in implementing principles and standards.

Climate Friendly Future

Sustainability at the heart of our operations

The Caux Initiatives of Change Foundation

prioritizes sustainable energy and resource solutions as well as preserving the heritage of the **Caux Palace**. We are committed to reducing CO2 emissions and enhancing energy efficiency through the **Swiss Private Sector Energy Agency programme (AEnEC)**. In 2023, we partnered with **MyBluePlanet** on their **ClimateActions4Companies** programme, embedding climate protection into our culture. This strengthens the sustainability commitment of Hospitality for Change, raising awareness about ecology among employees and guests.

Authentic change begins within, rooted in our deepest values and beliefs. When our actions align with our authentic selves, we inspire trust in others and lead effectively by example, fostering genuine transformation.





At **Caux Initiatives of Change**, the arts have always played an important role in connecting people and in creating bridges across our world's divides. Our concept of **Hospitality for Change** is not only about providing the best possible welcome and service at the **Caux Palace**, but also about recognizing the power of artistic expression to promote understanding, reconciliation and positive social change.

In April, **Marc Isserles** and the **LEBEDIK** group presented their moving show to a class of school children in the Caux Palace theatre. The one-man show, which is accompanied by two Klezmer musicians, tells the true story of Marc's grandparents who fled Budapest during the Shoah with their two children, finding refuge in Caux In November, the **Caux Palace** hosted the filming of scenes for **Winter Palace**, a historical drama co-produced by Netflix and RTS. Directed by Pierre Monnard, the series will air in late 2024 and allow the general public to discover this emblematic historical site through watching a story that authentically captures its beginnings.



In September, Maria de la Paz and her musicians captivated over 300 people in the Caux Palace theatre with a performance that conveyed messages of hope, passion, and humanity. The event, attended by refugees and representatives of humanitarian and cultural organisations, was organized by Caux Initiatives of Change with speeches from the UNHCR and the Swiss PAIRES association on migrant support and inclusion.

In December, the **Emergences Musicales** programme by **Saison Culturelle de Montreux** brought nine young artists to the Caux Palace, under the guidance of **Francis Cabrel**. The programme culminated in a concert for 350 attendees, that also celebrated Montreux's **UNESCO City of Music** designation. Two concerts by Cabrel that week allowed the general public to discover the Caux Palace.


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Creative Leadership is a youth-led initiative of **Caux Initiatives of Change** which offers an inclusive space for diverse participants from around the world. They undertake a journey of personal and collective growth, using arts, story-sharing, workshops and dialogue groups to reconceptualize leadership. Their participation has enabled the voices of young people to be heard at key events in International Geneva.

Weaving our Narratives

In September, the **Creative Leadership** youth team ran an eight-session course for 31 participants, who explored the power of their stories through art, self-discovery, connections and authentic sharing. The programme stressed the role of storytelling in leadership and change.



Geneva PeaceTalks

In November, Daniel Clements, programme manager for Creative Leadership, co-moderated the Geneva Peace Week's PeaceTalks with Sarah Noble. Panelists included a poet, a peacebuilder, an artist, a climate change activist, an educator, and a genocide survivor—all of whom shared their personal stories under the theme of 'Leadership for peace'. The discussions showed that the journey toward peace is seldom linear and that the route to reconciliation and breaking the cycles of trauma involves acknowledgement, apology, forgiveness and, fundamentally, trust.

IOM International Dialogue on Migration

In October, **Viviane Straub** represented the **Creative Leadership** youth team at the **IOM International Dialogue on Migration** in Geneva, advocating for youth involvement in developing new policies and solutions for those impacted by climate change.



Young people are mobilizing to imagine worlds otherwise, and need support. We need to be in dialogue in order to co-create solutions. Human Resources

Diversity, Equity and Inclusion

In 2023 the **Caux Initiatives of Change Foundation** adopted a new HR strategy prioritizing diversity, equity and inclusion. The strategy leverages the talents of our team, with its diversity of age, gender, background and approach. It integrates our culture, human resources, and systems with such lofC initiatives as the **Culture of Care Conversations** forum. The strategy emphasizes transparency and mutual care and reflects our commitment to respecting the call to service of staff, volunteers, consultants and short-term contractors.

In 2024 we will reinforce our volunteer base, which we recognize is vital to implementing our strategy and maximizing our impact.

In 2023 we have focused on diversity in our many activities. Through the **Creative Leadership** group, we ensure that youth voices are represented in our staff meetings and at International Geneva events.

We have also pushed for gender equity on panels and in our meetings.

In 2024, **Ignacio Packer** will join the **International Gender Champions Network**, uniting over 333 top decision-makers from international organizations, embassies, civil society and the private sector who are committed to breaking gender barriers and promoting gender equality in their spheres of influence.

Partnering with EVAM

In September 2023, **EVAM**, the Vaud Reception Centre for Migrants, inaugurated a new centre in the former **Le Sorbier** hotel in Caux, offering refuge to up to 50 migrants. We have launched a professional integration initiative with three of our new neighbours at the EVAM centre and are offering other opportunities for social interaction, as we understand how important meaningful human connections are for people adjusting to a new country.



What distinguishes the work of the **Caux Initiatives of Change Foundation** is its emphasis on personal transformation and the capacity for individual action. By encouraging individuals to take responsibility and through its strong belief that change is possible, this initiative makes a valuable contribution to efforts for peace and democracy worldwide. **Caux Initiatives of Change** has made a strong commitment by supporting the concept of "refugee builders", thus highlighting the potential for positive transformation that refugees bring to our societies.

Safeguarding

Safeguarding the well-being of individuals



Safeguarding involves creating a safe environment where individuals are empowered to uphold both personal and organizational values. This may involve a cultural shift. While policies and guidelines offer crucial support, they alone are not sufficient to drive cultural transformation.

In 2023, **Caux Initiatives of Change** expanded staff training on safeguarding-related topics, increased management engagement, and enhanced tools for staff input and feedback.

We mandated an external trusted person to play a role in maintaining organizational integrity and transparency, especially in relation to such sensitive issues as abuse, misconduct and safeguarding.

In June a new communication agreement was adopted, with principles aimed at fostering a safe space for honest conversations.

We also adopted the **Aretha Charter** which establishes clear guidelines for creating a safe and judgement-free space and our team underwent training to ensure its implementation. In 2023, we addressed two safeguarding incidents, prioritizing the well-being of those affected, providing support, conducting thorough investigations, implementing preventive measures and reinforcing complaint mechanisms. We also held listening conversations with former staff members to understand their experiences and inform our ongoing efforts to improve organizational culture and support. We are dedicated to preventing and addressing misconduct and to fostering a safe and respectful environment where discrimination, misconduct and abuse are not tolerated.

Safeguarding the environment

Safeguarding individuals goes hand in hand with protecting the environment, including reducing carbon emissions and mitigating climate change.

Over a decade ago Caux chose to transition to renewable energy, and to promote energy efficiency and protect and restore ecosystems. Shifts in societal norms and consumption patterns demand that still more is done.

Carbon reduction is a moral and social justice imperative, given its disproportionate impact on vulnerable communities worldwide. It exacerbates inequalities and threatens livelihoods. Our 2030 strategy advocates for policy changes, technological innovations, operational adaptations and shifts in behaviour.

As we continue toward a sustainable future, we must recommit to reducing carbon emissions. By working together and embracing bold and decisive actions, we can safeguard both individuals and the environment, ensuring a resilient future for all.

Infrastructures Committee

In September 2023, the Caux Foundation established a permanent working group within its Council, called the **"Infrastructures Committee"** whose main task is to advise the Council and the Foundation's management on the renovation of the Caux Palace, Villa Maria, and other Foundation properties.
