Global Convenors



SOFIA STRIL-REVER, a spiritual activist and teacher, is an award-winning author, public speaker, and the biographer of His Holiness the Dalai Lama. She co-authored 4 books with him, translated into over twenty languages and she adapted his life story for the screen in the biopic, *Dalai Lama, One Life After the Other*.

In 2016 at the Paris Bar, Sofia convened the international conference *Law, Universal Responsibility and Environment*, featuring the Dalai Lama alongside 350 lawyers and environmental experts. Since 2018, she has co-organized the Better We Better World seminars in Dharamsala, facilitating dialogue between young global leaders, the Dalai Lama and Professor Samdhong Rinpoche.

Sofia speaks regularly at the United Nations in Geneva and served as the global convener of the International Day of Conscience on 5 April in 2023 and 2024, addressing the theme of Loveforce Leadership. Additionally, she is the co-founder and vision holder of the LoveForce Foundation, the founding President of [BeTheLove](#) and author of a meditation protocol for heart and mind awakening aimed at leaders and changemakers to transition from individualism to altruism, accelerating the implementation of the 2030 Agenda and fostering the rise of a civilization centred on love.



IGNACIO PACKER is Executive Director of the Caux Initiatives of Change Foundation, a Swiss private charitable foundation with the mission to provide a safe and privileged space to inspire, equip and connect individuals, groups and organizations from around the globe to engage effectively and innovatively in the promotion of trust, ethical leadership, sustainable living and human security.

Ignacio has over 30 years of experience in humanitarian work and development issues. He is an expert on human rights and social issues and has been strongly engaged in global advocacy on protection frameworks for migrants and refugees with a particular focus on children and youth.



SARAH NOBLE is Head of Global Engagement at Caux Initiatives of Change. She has dedicated her career to building a better world and is passionate about showcasing people's stories on how we can build peace with each other and the planet.

Sarah has held leadership positions at international organisations focused on peacebuilding, humanitarian issues, and independent media. She is also co-founder and Curator of the Peace Talks at Interpeace that have taken place in more than 8 countries with over 8.000 attendees and more than 200 speakers from over 50 countries.




PASCALE FRESSOZ is the Founding President of International Alliance for the Sustainable Millenium Goals (AI-ODD International).

RENAUD RUHLMANN, a trilingual self-taught, has dedicated himself for nearly 10 years to the therapeutic revaluation of sound. His research in electrophysiology and botanical sound therapy is revolutionising the understanding of plant communication.

As founder of NaturaSounds, he created the first sound herbalism in 2019, does research in molecular sound chemistry and develops artistic projects like R Racine and "l'âme agit". He also works for the

protection of plant rights. Pioneer also in vibrational gastronomic research, Renaud shares his love for plants from seeds to plate and explores the functioning of living organisms through sound frequencies of molecules.

The book "The Secret Melody of Plants" (November 2021) reveals his research on plant consciousness and practices around sound and music with plants.

CARL BJERTNES, President SEEDS-Africa (Social Entrepreneurship & Enterprise Development Strategies)




KAREN BJÖRK is driven by a passion for sustainable development and social impact across civil society, public, and private sectors and currently focusing on scalable solutions for climate action.

solutions for climate, horizontality and collective creation of shared narratives for new futures. With a law degree from the University of Kinshasa, she has been a lawyer for over ten years at the Goma Court of Appeal in North Kivu. The new Minister of Human Rights is also known for her commitment to defending and promoting human rights, in particular those of marginalized people and prisoners of conscience, through her association Univers de Paix pour le Développement.

On the political front, Chantal Chambu Mwavita is president of the political party Mouvement National pour la Démocratie et le Progrès (MONADEP).

ELSA CUISSARD is an interdisciplinary researcher and project organiser based in Berlin, whose work explores the intersection of knowledge production, art, and socio-political change.

Her current research investigates the intersection of knowledge production and political ecology, approaching these issues from both academic and artistic perspectives, and she is also the author of several published articles on these topics.

Two years ago, she co-founded Collective Webs, an initiative dedicated to fostering collaborative learning and mutual support through artistic projects. Conceived as a collaborative network, Collective Webs' projects center on decolonial pedagogies, collective healing, and horizontal exchange, aiming to critically engage with collective narratives and knowledge systems that nurture sustainable planetary relationships.

and contributed in Italy to the creation of the "Fondo aiuti italiani" endowed with 1 billion dollars for international development aid.

A conscientious objector, he has been international secretary of the International Fellowship of Reconciliation, an inter-faith peace and justice global organization headquartered in the Netherlands, then in Denmark and Belgium, and made numerous

trips to Latin America promoting non-violence and collaborating with union, peasant and indigenous movements.


PRISCILA FISCHER, Vice-President of AI-ODD (France/Brazil)



LINDA LEOGAH FORKWA is a community peacebuilder who holds a double masters degree in International Relations at the University of Buea in Cameroon and MA in Governance and Regional Integration at the Pan African University Institute of Governance, Humanities and Social Sciences at the University of Yaounde II under the sponsorship of the African Union.

Through her association with Home for Humanity, she created a transformative model in 2023 known as Integral Lewaah Revolution Cameroon (ILR) that addresses issues of drug trafficking and abuse among male youths of Mutengene her community. The ILR employs the Na We We (We Are One) methodology that underlines the values of Sharing, Togetherness, and Responsibility and introduces purposeful education that prioritizes local knowledge and cultural values.

In 2024, the ILR won the LoveForce Awards and became a LoveForce Ambassador in Cameroon.




JEAN-MARC GOVERNATORI is a public servant, entrepreneur, and environmental advocate with a distinguished career spanning politics, business, and social impact. Currently serving as a Nice Côte d'Azur city and metropolitan councillor, he has been at the forefront of sustainable policies and environmental action in the region.

Recognized for his leadership, he has twice been named Best Manager in France and is the recipient of the Trophée de l'Emploi, awarded by the Minister for SMEs. His commitment to social causes is evident in his roles as a delegate for A.R.S.E.P. (Aide à la Recherche sur la Sclérose en Plaques) and a former delegate for

SOS SAHEL, working to advance medical research and humanitarian aid. An accomplished author, Governatori has written 16 books, including three prefaced by renowned scientist Albert Jacquard. His expertise in ecology, public health, and consumer behavior has made him a sought-after lecturer in these fields. He also co-founded the Ligue nationale contre la drogue alongside scientist Gabriel Nahas, reinforcing his commitment to public well-being.

Governatori's dedication to animal rights and environmental sustainability has earned him a 20/20 rating from Politique Animaux (L214) and recognition for having the best climate programme in the 2021 regional elections, as ranked by Réseau Action Climat (WWF, Agir pour l'environnement, Greenpeace, etc.). Following his electoral success, he was appointed President of the Office régional environnemental Sud. His impact and unique approach to ecological politics are documented in the book *Jean Marc Governatori, écologiste inclassable* by journalist Mathias Leboeuf, published in September 2022.

With a career dedicated to social progress, environmental protection, and ethical governance, Jean-Marc Governatori continues to shape policies that drive positive change for both people and the planet.



PROF. SCHERTO GILL is the Director of the Global Humanity for Peace Institute at the University of Wales Trinity St David and a Senior Fellow at the Guerrand-Hermes Foundation, an international peace think-tank. She is also a Life Fellow of the Royal Society of the Arts (FRSA) and a laureate of the 2022 Luxembourg Peace Award.

Scherto leads the UNESCO Collective Healing Initiative and chairs the G20 Interfaith Forum's Education Working Group. Her research focuses on peace, human flourishing, and the ecology of well-being, with a strong emphasis on educational innovation, collective healing, and social transformation.

As an educator and writer, she explores human-centred education, positive peace, deep dialogue, and collaborative global governance. She also facilitates safe spaces for generative dialogue, fostering deeper understanding of global challenges.

Scherto serves on the boards of the Spirit of Humanity Forum and the Rising Global Peace Forum.

Furthermore, Kaivalya Kashyap is the president of the non-profit associations MaitriBodh Peace Services and their youth wing YGPT, active in Germany, Austria, Italy and Switzerland, transforming society through social services for the underprivileged, nature and youth empowerment. In the International Spiritual Council for Transforming Humanity (Geneva), Kaivalya Kashyap acts as president to bring together individuals, organisations and governments, working hand in hand towards a peaceful world through human transformation.



Recipient of a doctorate under Nobel Peace Prize Laureate Elie Wiesel's direction and an MBA of ESSEC Business School, **DR. GUILA CLARA KESSOUS** is a UNESCO Artist for Peace, Peace Ambassador and executive coach.

She combines performing art and activism working as an "artist" helping population victims of post-traumatic syndroms. She has worked with displaced population in Bangladesh (Rohingyas), in Rwanda (survivors of genocides) as well as in Congo with Nobel

Peace Prize Laureate Dr. Mukwege. As a teacher at the Harvard Carr Center for Human Rights Policies at Harvard Kennedy School, she created the course "Theatre and Human Rights" and received the Derek Bok Center Award for excellence in teaching. As an executive coach, she developed specific training using role games and Harvard negotiation techniques to enhance executive inner empowerment. She became "Rising Talent" for the Women's Forum for the Economy and the Society helping thousands of executives for a more assertive and positive leadership. She is running the International Day of Women's Rights and World Art Day at UNESCO. Dr Kessous has been knighted by the French government.



CHRISTINA KITSOS is the Mayor of Geneva, holds both Swiss and Greek nationalities and is mother of two children.

Her political involvement began at the age of 13, when she joined the Youth Parliament in her hometown, driven by her commitment to equality, social and climate justice, and the vision of an open, inclusive society grounded in solidarity. These values inspired her to join the Socialist Party. Over the years, Ms. Kitsos has held various public roles, including

Parliamentary Assistant in Bern (2007–2008), Member of the Parliament of Neuchâtel (2005–2008), and Member of the Municipal Council of the City of Geneva (2015–2020).

In June 2020, Ms. Kitsos was elected to the Executive Council of the City of Geneva, where she assumes responsibility for the Department of Social Cohesion and Solidarity. Her dedication to public service culminated in her election as Mayor of the City of Geneva on June 1, 2024.

Ms. Kitsos holds a Master of Business Administration (MBA) from HEC Geneva and a Master's Degree in Literature and Humanities from the University of Neuchâtel and Sorbonne-Paris IV.
